POLICY:

Anthem Medicaid is contracted with the State of California for Medi-Cal Managed Care to provide Child Health and Disability Program (CHDP) services, including:

- wellness checks;
- health assessments;
- lab screenings; and
- immunizations/vaccines.

School-linked services play a major role in providing children access to preventive care and early intervention services. Anthem Medicaid coordinates with, and provides support for, school-based clinics that provide CHDP services.

The Primary Care Provider (PCP), as the "medical home", is the primary case manager for members and shall provide coordination of care for members who receive CHDP services through the local school districts or school sites. School-based clinics must ensure that PCPs are notified when services are rendered to members. However, when necessary Anthem Medicaid's Medical Management Department may provide care coordination and case management in collaboration with the member's treating physician.

The school-based clinic may provide any medically necessary CHDP service through qualified practitioners and will receive reimbursement for such services.

DEFINITIONS:

CHDP: The Child Health and Disability Prevention (CHDP) is a preventive program that delivers periodic health assessments and services to low income children and youth in California. The CHDP program is administered by the Children's Medical Services Branch of the Department

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of Health Care Services (DHCS) and is operated through the CA Medi-Cal Managed Care contract.

PROCEDURE:

I. School-Based Clinics Responsibilities

- A. School-based clinics are responsible for the following:
 - 1. Establish system for coordinating care and sharing medical information with PCPs.
 - 2. Make reasonable efforts to obtain member's necessary medical information in order to avoid duplication of services. This should include use of the regional Immunization Registry if possible.
 - 3. Educate members on managed care and promote follow-up with the PCP.
 - 4. Contact the member's PCP for children identified at school sites as being in need of further services to ensure coordination of care and appropriate referrals as necessary.
 - 5. Ensure appropriate notification to parent(s) on where to receive follow-up service.
 - Notify the PCP of services provided to his/her members at the school-based clinic. This should include completion of the PM 160 Information Only Form. The PCP notification must be documented in the member's medical record
 - 7. Prepare and maintain all appropriate records on members receiving services from the school-based clinic according to legal requirements.
 - 8. All CHDP services rendered will be reported with claim submission including PM160-Information Only Form to either the member's assigned Primary Medical Group (PMG) or to Anthem Blue Cross Medicaid.

II. PCP Responsibilities

A. The Primary Care Provider (PCP), as the "medical home", is the primary case manager for members and shall provide coordination of care for members who receive CHDP services through the local school districts or school sites.

III. Anthem's Medical Management Department Responsibility

A. Medical Management may collaborate with the member's PCP to assist in coordinating care and/or provide case management services, if needed.

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B. Otherwise, additional services needed as a result of the assessments provided under this program (ex: speech, occupational, and/or physical therapies) would be provided under the basic Medi-Cal benefits and through the standard referral process.
