POLICY:

In compliance with the Newborns' and Mothers' Health Act of 1996, Anthem Medicaid (Anthem) does not restrict a member's hospital length of stay during obstetrical inpatient hospitalizations to a time period less than 48 hours for vaginal deliveries and less than 96 hours following cesarean section deliveries. Anthem does not require a provider to obtain prior authorization for this length of stay. The exception to this is when the treating physician, in consultation with the mother, agrees to an early discharge. If an early discharge is planned, the mother and newborn are offered a home health follow-up visit within 48 hours of discharge.

PROCEDURE:

I. OB admissions for delivery:

- A. Upon admission notification to Anthem, a case is created for authorization only if:
 - 1. The member is admitted to an out of network facility.
 - 2. The member has a medical condition to warrant a continued length of stay.
 - 3. The member's continued length of stay is greater than 48 hours after vaginal delivery, or 96 hours after cesarean section.

II. Member requests early discharge:

- A. If the member makes the decision to discharge from the hospital prior to the end of the originally authorized timeframe, the treating physician must disclose (to the mother) the availability of a post-discharge follow-up visit, including a home health, physician office, or planned facility visit.
- B. The member's provider must request an authorization for a post-discharge home health follow-up visit. The visit will include the following:

- 1. This visit is made by a licensed health care provider whose scope of practice includes postpartum care and newborn care.
- 2. The visit will include, at a minimum, parent education, assistance and training in breast or bottle feeding and the performance of any necessary maternal or neonatal physical assessments.
