	 LiveHealth Online Utilization Medi-Cal Renewals - majority of disenrollments continue to be due to procedural issues – paperwork not received on time or incomplete. Anthem continues to exert its efforts in bringing awareness to the Medi-Cal beneficiaries through various communication campaigns such as direct mail, digital and social media, outbound calls, events, Community Advisory Committee meetings, etc. Refer to page 14 and 15 of the presentation slides for more details. 	 Health Equity in Sacramento County – Mayra Serrano shared Health Equity report stratified by member demographics – ethnicity, language, and gender. Social Needs – Substance Abuse, Interpersonal Violence, Financial Insecurity, Transportation Insecurity, Housing Instability, Transportation Insecurity, and Food Insecurity. Sacramento County has the highest rate in Substance Abuse in comparison with other counties/region: Los Angeles, Fresno, Santa Clara, and Tulare. Health Disparities – refer to slide 7 through 9 on the impacted populations around asthma, cardiovascular disease, preterm birth, diabetes, and immunizations. 	Mayra Serrano
	 CalAIM Updates – Carissa Avalos provided updates around the following topics listed below. Enhanced Care Management (ECM) – reviewing the network that have been established and conducting quality assessment to identify any gaps. New Population of Focus (PoF) for ECM Justice Involved (JI)– effective January 1, 2024, MCPs are responsible for administering ECM for JI PoF once an individual is released from incarceration. Anthem is working with county, correctional facilities, and other MCPs to prepare for this PoF, including data sharing. Birth Equity – effective January 1, 2024, aimed to improve prenatal and postpartum care and closing disparities in access to care. Child and Youth – effective July 1, 2023, for children and youth with highest social and clinical risk enrolled in Medi-Cal Managed Care Plans (MCPs). 	Carissa Avalos

	 Community Support (CS) – Anthem is live for all 14 approved DHCS services and continues to accept LOIs (Letter of Interest) for those providers who are interested in participating the network. Housing workgroup – meets regularly and works closely to ensure that housing network is adequate. Anthem is using HHIP (Homeless Housing Incentive Program) funds to invest in the community around housing. Community Health Worker – Anthem has received LOIs (Letter of Interests) and continuing to extend invitations to CHWs who are interested in contracting. Doula – Anthem received has received LOIs (Letter of Interest) and continuing to extend invitations to CHWs who are interested in contracting. Street Medicine – this benefit became effective as of January 1, 2024, for Medi-Cal. Anthem is working in finalizing contracting process to build the network.

IV.	 Sacramento County Public Health Updates: CCS – no update 	Sacramento County Public Health
	 CHDP – Lynnan Svensson shared that CHDP will sunset on June 30, 2024. Final transition plan has not come out yet. The CHDP funding is anticipated to shift for Foster Care Administrative and CCS oversight and monitoring; however, this has been delayed for a year. Anthem is requesting from Public Health for listing of providers that have completed FSR (Facility Site Reviews) audits and Medical Records Review (MMR) and/or recently scheduled, and trainings, i.e., audiometric vision, anthropometric, and fluoride varnish. Lynnan advised to contact Leesa Hooks and Cynthia Johnston to help facilitate with the transition. Immunizations – Rachel Allen shared that they are working specifically with schools to follow-up on kids who were admitted conditionally and are missing the vaccines to help close the gaps. COVID funding will run through June 2024.  UC Davis had a childhood measles in their emergency room. As a result, county is conducting a follow-up on a number of
different individuals who may have been exposed.
• CDPH recently sent an alert surrounding the global increase of
measles cases. People traveling should be aware of it and ensure that they are up to date with the vaccinations
 that they are up to date with the vaccinations. If a child is brought to the emergency room with the rash, they
should be placed in an isolation until they rule out measles.
 Testing for measles can take several hours. Dr. Kasirye advised
not to take the child immediately to the emergency room if
he/she has a rash but rather call ahead of time and ensure that
appropriate measures are taken.
 Public Health lab can conduct testing and tires to accommodate
the testing right way. Otherwise, a delay of day or two can
occur in obtaining the results.
• There is a short window in giving the post exposure
prophylaxis. For people who have not been vaccinated for measles, the vaccine will need to be given within 72 hours after
exposure. Others who can not receive it, i.e., children less than 1
year old, pregnant women, or individuals with compromised
immune system, will need to order the immunoglobulin which
needs to be ordered. This can be administered within the first
six days post exposure to help protect them. If those window,
for people who are not immune, they will need to be monitored
for about two to three weeks to ensure that they do not develop
symptoms.
 MCAH/CPSP – Jackie Washington Ashley shared that CPSP still expanding. MCAH is hosting Sacramento County MCAH Roundtable, scheduled on March 28, 2024, from11:30 am to 1:15pm. Speakers will be Dr. Melody Law and Lori Miller, LCSW. Jackie Washington-Ashley
emailed the flyer to Emely Arienza/Anthem. Jackie is inviting Anthem to share resources relative to perinatal SUD. Emely shared that SUD is a carved-out benefit from MCPs but will connect with Jackie to discuss resources and navigating with MCPs.

County has been working with Blue Zones Organization and planning to have a CEO roundtable soon.
