Introductions & Updates regarding MOU (MCP/MHP/DMC-ODS)	The meeting began with a welcome & introductions of all attendees. Darlene-Update on Consolidation of the MOU: ➤ The Mental Health and SUPT portion of the MOU that has been routed internally for review from our legal teams. They have also been submitted to other internal teams, including Jeanine's team, to review and provide feedback.	
Merging MOU with other DHS Departments/ MCP/Contacts	 Wendy Huynh- Merging of MOU: When the state released and published the MOU templates last fall, DHS (or Department of Health Services) decided that the approach was to have one primary MOU that has consistent language and includes the programs and services respective to public health and behavioral health. 	

	 Since there are several programs and services, instead of keeping track of multiple MOUs this will ensure there is only one MOU per plan with Sacramento County and the plan itself. The administrative department is going to merge the primary MOU with the draft MOU that Dana and Darlene have been working on with the team into one MOU between DHS with each respective managed care plan. 	
	Please note: Each plan will have an MOU with DHS.	
Merging MOU with other DHS Departments/ MCP/Contacts (continued)	 For example: There will be one MOU with DHS and Anthem, one MOU with DHS and Kaiser, one MOU with DHS and Health Net, & one MOU with DHS and Molina. There may be some deviation between plans, but the core minimum requirements should stay consistent across each plan. 	
	 Thursday, March 28th, 2024, is the target date for the finalization of our MOU for review and each plan's legal subject matter experts. The meeting will take place @ 10:00am-11:30am.

Data Exchange Updates	 Randy Nater: Molina has been working with the team testing out the data exchange and addressing the access/ password issues. There is a new method to access the SFTP and a file format that has been sent over to Pahoua to validate and provide information on how the file would be sent back. Wendy Huynh: Jeanine's team is working on the Social Health Information Exchange (or SHIE). The current status of the SHIE is they are in the RFP stage, looking for a technical vendor to help with the implementation of that. This will be a 3 to 5-year project. 	
SUPT Updates	 Stepanie Dasalla: The unit started a kickoff meeting a few weeks ago looking at DMCODS specific data elements for the SHIE. They are currently in audit season with state audits, EQRO, and monitoring contracted providers. Also working towards a plan for an integrated BHS access point. More information to follow.
