| AII. | Confidentiality Concerns: Providers need reassurance on maintaining confidentiality for adolescents. Family PACT covers birth control/STI testing, not other services like blood pressure checks. Prefer using primary insurance (e.g., Medical, Anthem) for comprehensive coverage. Concerns about confidentiality may deter use of primary insurance. Ensure staff and patients that confidentiality measures prevent home notifications from health plans. Seek guidance on communicating confidentiality assurances with health plans. Reassure that using Medical for birth control refills and related concerns (e.g., blood pressure) won't result in home notifications. Sensitive services tied to a visit remain confidential. No mail or communication regarding these services will be sent home, ensuring privacy. Set up meeting with Kimberlee Pitters (DPH), Anh Huynh, and ModivCare for transportation connectivity questions.
