Maternal Mental Health Services (continued)	using alcohol, cannabis, tobacco, and other substances. ✓ Our mission is to intervene early in pregnancy to provide encouragement and support while working to decrease complications and negative outcomes related to substance use. ✓ The Early Start care pathway begins with screening tools—the Prenatal Screening Questionnaire and Urine Drug Screens—typically completed at the start of pregnancy. ● If a patient screens positive, their physician introduces and recommends Early Start. ✓ An assessment visit with a local Early Start Specialist includes a full psycho-social assessment and thorough substance use screening. ● During this visit, psychoeducation on substance use during pregnancy is provided, along with resources for managing stress, reducing anxiety, maintaining a healthy pregnancy, and referrals to psychiatry for additional mental health treatment if needed. ✓ If recommended, the Early Start specialist can continue to support the patient throughout the pregnancy. ✓ Here is our external website: ● Early Start An holistic approach to health and wellness in pregnancy. ✓ Lastly, each ObGyn clinic has the ability to refer a patient with mental health needs to an appropriately trained practitioner. ✓ Our physicians have received training about diagnosing depression or mental health disorders in pregnancy as well as training on evidence-based treatments. ✓ There are also classes and groups available to clients.

MCP: ➤ Molina: ✓ They reported logistical issues occurring every so often where the tools are being sent to correct place but also being sent to the case management team which is causing a lot of rework and confusion. 	

Coordination of Care: Screening and Transition of Care tool Check-In - Report out (continued)	 Screening and transition tools only need to be sent to their Behavioral Health Solutions mailbox. Health Net: Their data moving forward will have a new section on it. Any member that is referred between the county and health plan will receive a referral for case management. The newly added field will quantify the number of case management referrals that will be occurring in each quarter. Anthem Blue Cross: Please see the attached Anthem Blue Cross PowerPoint Presentation. Kaiser Permanente: One of the plans from Kaiser is to provide more detailed updates moving forward. This will include both adult and child referrals, number of referrals, status both ways. BHS Updates	 We are updating our Closed Loop Referral Process that's incorporating our EHR. We will be having a user forum for our providers that use our EHR. Providers will be able to see that the referral is coming in from a managed care plan and be able to close that loop to state that the client is now enrolled in their services. The training will take place in March and the roll out date of that process will be around April 1st of this year. More information will be shared soon. General Referrals to BHS-SAC: Most are already aware that we have integrated services with the SUPT system of care Adult Program and the formerly known as ACCESS into the BHS-SAC. We are currently working on an integrated form that should be coming out within the next few weeks or so. The integrated referral form can be utilized for both adults and children seeking mental health services, substance use treatment services, or a combined request for both services.
