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

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I.	 Welcome Lali facilitated the meeting starting with introduction of the attendees from Fresno County Public Health, Anthem, CalViva Health, and Kaiser Permanente. 			
	Fresno County Updates	Fresno

	Joe Prado shared the following updates:	Team		
	 Governor Newsom's Proposed Budget - the governor's proposed budget included a statement of reducing and eliminating the future of public health funding. To balance the state budget given its significant budget deficit, it will impact the local public health department in the amount of \$6.1 million a year which 70% is mainly spent on staffing (43 positions). 			
	 Governor Newsom made the announcement and indicated that he was open to having conversation with the legislature. 			
	 County is hoping that legislature will now include public health at 100%. 			
	Meantime, the department is evaluation and putting a plan in place on how they can mitigate in keeping those positions and keeping the individuals within the department.			
	 County is developing a 5-year budget plan for the department to ascertain sustainability in managing existing positions in the event that the funding is eliminated. They will need to do some managing and balancing to ensure that they can keep their capacity. 			
	 If right now, the future of public health funding, legislatures said keep it in as is however, it is only budgeted through 2024 through next fiscal year 2025 and will have an impact to the department. 			
	 County does have a plan in place on how they can mitigate the impact to their staff and to some of the programs. 			
II.	 Joe extended its appreciation to CHEAC and the lobbyist up in Sacramento for 			
	their advocacy surrounding the funding for public health. He also gave			
	appreciation to the divisions within public health who have worked diligently in providing data which was shared to CHEAC and state lobbyist. The outcome showed a favorable result because the legislature seemed to have sided with CHEAC and local health departments to bring back all the funding.			
	 Multi Access Program (MAP) – this program has been around in Fresno 			
	County for about 6-8 years. This program has been funded through Department of Behavioral Health at 100% which equates to around \$1.1 million annually.			
	 It is focused on the unhoused population and patient navigation both in the metropolitan and rural areas of Poverello. 			
	 Poverello Department of Behavioral Health informed Department of Social Services and Department of Public Health that they can no longer fund the MAP to the fullest extent possible, as in previous years. 			
	 Recommendation was made to the division managers to do a site visit and assess how they are program is running and confirmed that is patient navigation. 			
	 Public Health is partnering with Behavioral Health to add additional funding to their contract to support sustainability of the program. 			
	 They want to be able to evaluate the CHW networks they have designed and built to determine opportunities in aligning with some of the existing programs and draw some Cal-AIM dollars. 			

- There will be an evaluation process in their department, Division of Health Policy. Wellness, headed up by Claudia Sandoval will be at the table and FCHIP to assist with the evaluation.
- It is rare to have 3 departments putting in all their money together for one program and really deciding on the one scope of work.
- COVID Equity Project extended appreciation to the department during COVID as they stood up this project which consisted of three coalitions, 1.)
 African American Coalition, 2.) Disability coalition, and 3.) Immigrant Refugee Coalition.
- There were over 20 plus CBO all working under one scope of work in in Department of Public Health
- They used fortified different funding sources to fund all the complete response. What they learned from the COVID response is what they want to use as a model and framework for the future.
- Community Information Exchange they are at the first part of using Suicide Prevention Project. Any child presenting with suicidal ideation in the emergency room, the school district nurse and school, school district counselors will receive a notification.
- Senate Bill 929 has a compliance mandate that Department of Behavioral Health must meet where they are able to have a report on 51/50s.
- They see a great opportunity to meet the Senate bill requirements by just expanding their algorithm.
- Second is the home visitation.
- County is contracted with Manifest MedEx which is the health information exchange for the Central Valley – Kings, Madera, Tulare, and Fresno counties.
- They are also entering into negotiations with Manifest Medex to build them a Community Information Exchange and will start with home visitation.
- Joe noted to MCPs that they want the data exchange to be done thru HIE because they will ultimately have their providers and Community Based Organizations CBOs) share data thru HIE.
 - Lali mentioned Anthem is also working on their infrastructure and data exchange platforms such as contracting and working with Manifest MedEx.
 - Emely Arienza appreciated the information that Joe shared, particularly on the county's data exchange capability thru Manifest MedEx and around the expectations on the data exchange framework. She also inquired if Fresno County signed the Data Sharing Agreement (DSA) with CalHHS. Joe confirmed that they have not signed the DSA because there is one piece of the data exchange framework which is giving patients access to their data. It is currently a challenge they are facing given their existing IT infrastructure. However, they can meet the requirements with the Community Information components that they created which is going to be built into the technical specifications.

IV.	 Population Health Management – Lali shared Anthem's CHA/CHIP engagement. Lali also referenced the following resources: Medi-Cal Renewal – DHCS Dashboard & Full Scope Medi-Cal Expansion for Adults Ages 26 through 49 Regardless of Immigration Status https://www.dhcs.ca.gov/services/medi-cal/eligibility/Pages/Adult-Expansion.aspx. Dr. Zweifler shared that he heard that some individuals are hesitant to sign up due to concerns about how it might affect their immigration status. He requested for report number of enrollee's that falls under that category showing both numerator and denominator but if unable to obtain both, he is fine with numerator. Lali and Emely Arienza shared that county department of social services (DSS) should have the information on those Medi-Cal beneficiaries with restricted aid code which may have already been converted to full scope as per the Medi-Cal Expansion guidelines for adults ages 26 through 49 years old regardless of immigration status. Dr. Solis concurred that DSS should have the information. She also shared that Covered California is having round table at the end of the month and will have a panel and Q&A session for the community. The media is invited to keep the word out.

VII.	 County sent a news release surrounding measles exposure which became a local and state headline. The exposure was an individual, not a resident of Fresno County, who had traveled and went through LAX and then to Fresno Airport. They will be assisting in monitoring exposed people on the flight. County messaging sent to have vaccine of MMR. Planning for back-to-school events for catch up of required immunizations. They also have a mobile unit which can offer routine vaccines as well as with the different community centers in their rural area.https://www.fresnocountyca.gov/Departments/Public-Health/About-Us/Fresno-County-Rural-Mobile-Health Avian Flu – department is keeping a close eye. There has been news about the three cases of farm workers (not in California) have developed the Avian because of being of having a close contact with dairy cattle. In California, the state health Department, as the local health departments, will deliver PPE to farmers upon request. This is for early preparation so that the farmer can have PPE available if an animal and dairy farm were to test positive. In the past 2022, they have seen infected poultry with Avian flu Fresno County. County has protocols in place. The Avian flu has a potential to change the virus. COVID – lessons learned from COVID, not only a town but nation is trying to prepare more quicker and having PPE readily available. Heat Warming Advisory – county put out a news release surrounding the extreme heat. The Public Health communication team updated their extreme heat website. Libraries hours are being extended for the days where they might be extreme heathttps://www.fresnocountyca.gov/Departments/Public-Health/Emergency-Services/Office-of-Emergency-Services-OES/Extreme-Heat. Dr. John Zweifler shared updates on the CalAIM Justice Involved population. 	
	 LHD, BH, and Probation are preparing to launch JI (justice involved)

	 The Department of Behavioral Health, Probation and FSR and Fresno Sheriff's Office received funding to help with the implementation. 	
	 They are finalizing the budget and hiring a consultant to assist in the process. 	
	 Looking forward to working closely with MCPs. 	
	Gifty Kwofie gave an update on the PEI.	
	 They are hosting a free community screening of the documentary film titled 	
	"Birth in Justice."	
	 The film will highlight moms and dads and advocates to share their

Will engage community in very meaningful conversation on how to achieve birth equity, especially within the Black African American populations. The screening will take place on July 13, 2024, Wednesday, from 5:00 pm 9:00 pm.

Community Health [CH] (includes Immunization /TB /DOT / CD/HIV /STD / CLPPP)

Immunization – Patricia Ramos shared the following:

- Bridge Access Program which provides the free vaccines for uninsured or underinsured adults is ending in August.
- o Program will not be purchasing the COVID-19 latest vaccine.
- When the new formulation is released, it is expected that all current inventories from last season will be deauthorized and will need to be wasted.
- School Vaccine need 10% or more submitted that are out of compliance.
- Visits were completed. Common IZ where Hep B. 216 records were reviewed,
 60 records were found to be out of compliance which is 28% of the records audited.

TB/DOT – Patricia Ramos shared the following:

- Still seeing influx of active and suspected TB.
- Currently there are 22 active TB patients in Fresno County which is again an influx from last year.
- Still continuing to promote the TB treatment to providers through presentations and follow-up on CMRs.
- o Answering provider questions and recommending doses and medication.

• HIV/STD – Jena Adams shared the following:

- HIV stakeholders meeting on track and meeting on the 4th Tuesday of the month from 2:30 pm 4:00 pm. New location at 1850 N. Gateway Blvd, Ste. 100. Anticipating to work/collaborate with 3 hospitals: Community Hospital of Fresno, Adventist Health Selma, and Adventist Health Reedley whom all were awarded Emergency Department screening program funding from the state.
- o All 3 hospital who received the funding have to develop a 6-month plan.
- Program in collaboration with Gifty with the Perinatal Equity Initiative to raise awareness on STI screening during prenatal and preconception.
- Working with National Media to produce commercials for 15 seconds and 32 seconds. Commercials that are in the cinemas right now, covering various topics.
- Collaborating with MCAH to put training around STI round table for public health nurses on July 17th.
- Last month they were informed that Fresno State, along with three clinics from Sacramento were awarded funding to participate in a 2-year demonstration project for HIV PrEP.
- Fresno received funding for Hepatitis C screening and will be submitting budget plan on June 14th.
- Overwhelmed with 200 syphilis cases that are open-under investigation.
- o County to continue to meet with providers surrounding syphilis screening.
- There are 30 HIV positive cases that are under investigation and need to check if they are newly diagnosed or previously diagnosed to ensure they are linked to care.
- Staffing: have 2 staff on leave of absence. Have one vacancy in their AIDs
 Drug Assistance program. An offer has been made and hope to start on June
 24th. They currently have 3 staff.

- Harm Reduction Vending Machine Jena is working with Tristan/Staff
 Analyst. They will use Redcap for the survey and the pin number.
- Syphilis there 200 syphilis and congenital syphilis cases in Fresno County which are under investigation.

• CD / COVID - Maria Rangel shared the following updates:

- CDI cases there are 344 CDI cases for 2024. Top three are:
 Salmonella (51), animal bites (107) and Outbreak (40). Of the outbreaks, 27 are COVID outbreaks so far for 2024. They have changed reporting updates following AFL 23-08.
 - A3 carbon pentamidine resistance organisms 11 CP CRPO and Candida auris cases.
 - Monitoring measles currently there are 9 measles contacts until June 9th.
 The 9 measles contacts were the passengers on that same flight as they
 confirmed measles index on 5/19. They are calling daily and passive
 monitoring. Seven have their MMR vaccines.
 - Working with Fresno airport and monitoring 13 out of the 15.
 - Avia Flu currently working on creating new workflow for the Avian flu monitoring with the cattle.

• CLPPP - Keyna

Not available to provider report.

Public Health Nursing [PHN] (includes MCAH/CPSP/CHDP)

• MCAH – Lillarose Bangs shared the following:

- Wrapping up the new five-year needs assessment currently in the last year of the past five-year assessment. New one will start in 2025.
- Working with a consulting firm to help compile all the data that they collected.
- Babies First program name to be changed as county did not renew contract with Babies First. This will be part of Public Health Nursing.
- Jennifer reported being fully staff and serving greater number of population (3 Spanish speaking staff).
- Ah mentioned Babies First program / staff will transition under the state general fund expansion. Team are preparing for this transition but have not started. Staff will be looking to identify moms that may not qualify for existing home visitation programs.
- CalViva and Anthem providing monthly report of pregnant members for enrollment into home visitation programs. Jennifer, Ah and Lilarose appreciated the partnership.
- Lali inquired if Anthem could get outcome information on the list of members provided, e.g., members enrolled in NFP program, BIH, etc.
- Lillarose and Ah confirmed the county tracks this information and can provide.

• Black Infant Health (BIH) - Sabrina/Gifty shard the following updates.

- BH and PH is hosting birthing justice screening on June 12th from 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm at 700 Van Ness Ave.
- This firm will highlight moms and dads and advocates who have lived experiences sharing their experiences and hopefully the maintenance to really engage community and discussions on how to decrease those disparities that we're seeing within the Black African American population when it comes to outcomes.

- Working closely with females for support of Black Angel Mommies. It is a safe space created for moms that identify as black African Americans that are grieving because of a pregnancy loss or infant loss.
- Starting this coming fiscal year every second Saturday of every month, they will meet and will be held at the Black Wellness Prosperity Center. Refer to flyer.



• CPSP - Natalie Adolph shared the following updates:

- Natalie is the now the permanent Supervising PHN within Public Health Nursing Program and childcare linkages program.
- Perinatal Services Coordinator position is open someone has shared interest and will post in a month as to who will transition in that role.
- Perinatal Services Program is working closely with the California Health Collaborative and other community partners within the Gestational Diabetes Collaborative.
- Would like to work with MCPs to identify gaps surrounding gestational diabetes.
- Looking for data of how many women developed type 2 diabetes.
- Other collaborative task force is the Preeclampsia Task Force. They are looking to combine those two-task force.
- Working with American Health Association to launch the blood pressure kits and CPT kits within their site. WIC has been part of the conversation, and the California Health Collaborative and Public Health Nursing Program are also in discussions.
- Wristband project anticipate launching within Fresno County.
- o Also looking at reevaluating the Preeclampsia Toolkit Project.
- On August 3rd, there is a breastfeeding rock and also planning the Central Valley Perinatal symposium, slated for September 12th.
- Last round table of the year will be in October and is geared towards pregnancy and infant loss.
- Home Visitation Program has had variety of different names but all comes down to funding sources.
 - Keeping it simple as far as outreaching and education.
 - There are five (5) home visiting nurses.
 - They have case managed over 152 children and have done 85 developmental screenings, 86 social emotional development, and 78 developmental referrals, 128 parent and child referrals.
 - Serving children from zero to 17 years old and offering case management services to pregnant moms.
- Natalie will share additional outreach flyers about their program when available.

• CHDP – Ann Vang shared the following updates:

- o CHDP to sunset in July 2024.
- Things in place and have met with MCPs related to training. Detailed list was sent to other MCPs regarding providers who have been trained and certified.
- Working with internal counterparts with their own division programs and with the network to make sure that they are addressing the gap and identifying moms that may qualify for existing home visitation programs.

Lali Witrago shared that Anthem provides report to the county public health (Jennifer is the recipient) which includes all their pregnant and postpartum moms, regardless of race, ethnicity, and language.

• Foster Care – Ann

- Met with some of the MCPs about CHDP related trainings and have sent a
 detailed list regarding providers that have been trained or oriented and
 certified.
- Foster Care still working on the DSS MOU between Foster Care Program and DSS. One of the holdups is on the temporary shelter for foster youth and how it impacts the scope of work for the nurses.
- Still working on the CWS and IHSS MOU. Looking to finalize soon. Hold-up is the temporary hold on the foster youth.
- Ann asked if there a list for Medi-Cal providers who sees their pediatric population that identifies walk-ins and open on the weekends with walk-ins.
 CHDP had a list, but it is smaller than the MCPs.
 - Anthem Lali will check with Lynnette Silvering/Provider Relationship to if they have a listing of pediatric providers who takes walk-ins during operation hours and weekends. Additionally, she shared that member could access their telehealth platforms and service available 24/7 for medical. It is not intended to replace PCP but should access for non-emergency visit with a physician.
 - CalViva Rosa will check to see internally if they have a list of pediatric providers who takes walk-ins during operation hours and weekends. She will send an email to Ann Lee.
 - Kaiser Melissa will check with Foster Youth liaison for the list of the pediatrics providers offering walk-ins during operation hours and weekends, particularly for foster youth population.
 - Ann also added that this request might not be applicable as children and youth in foster care typically have straight Medi-Cal.
- Children's Medical Services [CMS] (includes CCS) Pilar / Heather / Sonya
 - Not available to provider report.

• <u>Health Policy and Wellness (community engagement, etc.)</u> – Claudia shared the following updates:

- Lead Health Community Worker Program thru FCHIP Hope Hub and Health Disparities Program. MAP will be added into that process.
- CHW contracts and work is being funded through a couple of funding sources.
 One of them, including the expansion laboratory capacity or ELC funding are
 CDC health disparities funding. They were able to get a no cost extension for another two years; thus, through 2026 they are able to continue funding some of the work.
- Working on their sustainability efforts capitalizing on the CalAIM reimbursement.
- o Looking to explore ECM through their CHW work that they are leading.
- Excited to maximize the funding and utilize efforts to provide health education to the community members on any emerging health topics.
- CHA has been posted in their website 5-year community plan.

Working on the final draft of the CHIP – determined goal and objective based on findings from the CHA. Next steps are for their team to roll out some community stakeholder meetings. Working with MCPs on SMART goals and CHIP objectives and strategies and have been meeting monthly. They are now in the next phase of data collection process. o Fresno is part of the regional group that is comprised of the local health jurisdiction and hospitals who have the CHNA that gets complete every 3 years. There is an opportunity to align with the hospital cadence and will be considering it in 2027. Working alongside with three counties through the organization of the local hospital council. • They have a consultant who will be supporting with the data collection efforts. o They are working on compiling a list for Fresno County for those who can serve as a key informant interview partner. And considering MCAH partners who are finalizing their MCAH needs assessments. The top three CHIP priorities are: 1. Nutrition and physical activities 2. Behavioral Health/SUD, and 3. Equitable Access to Health care Next phase on data sharing. CHA data collected includes Madera, Kings includes hospital CHNA. Community Engagement session forthcoming. **Data Exchange MCPs Anthem Blue Cross:** Lali reported on Anthem's Membership, Transportation, and LiveHealth Online data. Redetermination Awareness, and CalAIM Doula, Community Health Worker, Enhanced Care Management, and Community Supports resources also shared. Refer to Anthem Data Report Fresno County PH Q2 2024.
