Public Health Program Updates: DPH Team **Staffing Updates:** 25 min **CCS:** Filling Positions currently (Biller and Clerk). Start dates before Mid-June. **CHDP:** Program still transitioning for sunset of program. 6/30. We are hoping that many of the staff can be absorbed by MCAH. We have time to work on our budget. Temporary positions will be impacted more than permanent positions. **CCHP**: Recently filled vacant position for Public Health Nurse. MCAH/CPSP: CPSP Transitioning. that work is transitioning over to MCPs and we're holding it in limbo at the moment. Currently helping internally at the San Francisco Health Network with the CALAIM works. Pregnant population of focus, we are trying to figure out how we can include more enhanced case manager programs. BIH: still have vacancies. Coordinator Role, Clerical Role. Working in adding Community Outreach Liaison role. Added Family Health Advocate (Social Worker) **SIDS:** individual who's leading that work is out of the office right now but will return III. soon. She's the individual who supports the programs with well, childcare sides and individuals such as black infant health with safe sleep measures and then working on preterm birth reviews as well. IZ/HIV/STD/TB/COVID: No Update WIC: Continuing to provide services to over 13,000 moms, babies, and families. Working hard to meet deadlines. Understaffed, working closely with HR to fill vacancies. Coordinating moving to different sites or transitioning from a site they had, making sure that those needs are met. **FC:** serving approximately 1,100 foster children and youth. Family Planning Program: New Family planning team program staff Doctor Martin Escandon, reproductive health provider champion, and Jessica Alegria, Quality improvement coordinator. Working on our Title 10 and family planning grants. there's a lot of opportunity to collaborate with the health plans and have shared goals. QI Projects and Reports will help collaborate and share that data and then come up with those goals together. **Anthem Health Plan Updates:** Kalil Macklin **MOU Engagement:** 1. SSA Data Sharing **Adult Expansion: Anthem:** Adult Expansion A26-49 is to ensure individuals transitioning from restricted scope Medi-Cal or are otherwise uninsured to full-scope Medi-Cal maintain their existing Primary Care Provider (PCP) assignments to the maximum extent possible to minimize disruptions in services. As these individuals transition to full scope Medi-Cal, California has prioritized two IV. goals: 1) Maintain PCP assignment to the maximum extent possible; and 2) Support and strengthen traditional county health providers who treat a high volume of uninsured and Medi-Cal patients. Working on establishing a stand-alone DAA with SFDPH. SFTP Site is set up. Test files have successfully been exchanged. Data will be exchanged once DAA is established.

DEI: Participating in a workgroup that consists of San Francisco Health Plan, Santa Clara Family Health Plan, Kaiser, and Anthem to discuss how we will collaborate to fulfill the DEI APL requirements below.

Sharing and Exchange of Educational Resources

Met with Priscilla Chu (SFDPH), Bernadette Gates (SFDPH), Hilary Gillette-Walch (SFHP), Suzanne Samuel (SFHP), and Gretchen Shanofsky (Kaiser Permanente) to initiate conversations on meaningful participation in CHA/CHIP processes and co-developing SMART Goals that align with DHCS overall BOLD GOALS. We met the DHCS requirement and can attest to having engaged in conversation and started to develop our first SMART Goal.

By December 2025, San Francisco County and San Francisco, CalAIM Managed Care Providers (MCP) Anthem, Kaiser and the San Francsico Health Plan will work collaboratively to develop targeted MCP-specific interventions to improve the percentage of children aged 0 to 30 months who receive well-child visits to meet or exceed the DHCS 2023 MPL benchmarks and decrease disparities in rates for Black/African American and LatinX children by 20% when compared with the overall rates for these measures. - **2.** A CHW is a trusted member of the community they serve and is a link between health, social services, and the community to facilitate access to services and improve the quality and cultural competence of service delivered.
- **3.** CHWs are also known as promotors, community health representatives, or community health advisors.

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
