Madera County's system has quarantined the documents. Lori stated Diego has received the documents and will send them to the group internally.</p>	All

MOU Updates</p> <p>1) LHD MOU with Anthem, CalViva Health, and Kaiser Permanente currently under review by LHD.</p> <p>2) WIC MOU with Anthem, CalViva Health, and Kaiser Permanente executed on 1/7/25.</p> <p>3) Training and Education for WIC emailed on 3/26/25.</p> <p>i. Ilse reported WIC is considering going to the BOS to add a section to the MOU.</p> <p>ii. Ava from KP requested an update regarding LHD MOU time frame. Sara reported this is with her for review and hopes to do this soon.</p> <p>iii. <p>IV. County Program Updates</p> <p>1) General Updates – Sara</p> <p>i. Sara has been meeting with federal legislators and their staff related to Medi-Cal. Anticipated finding more bipartisanship during these meetings, however both</p>	Madera County Public Health & Women,



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<p>parties found some of these conversations frustrating by their inability to bridge the gaps.</p> <p>ii. One of California congressmen indicated that they are looking at work requirements for individuals on Medi-Cal. He shared that if Medicaid spending is not retained, the federal budget will not be able to sustain this in the next 10 years.</p> <p>iii. Sara communicated concerns around Medicaid cuts especially those impacting, hospitals serving largely the Medi-Cal population such as Madera's.</p> <p>iv. Sara referenced the change around the poverty level for Medi-Cal enrollment which was raised to 135% previously. She added that the Energy and Commerce Committee is looking at the ratio for how much the Feds vs the State contributes towards Medi-Cal and based on this they might be looking to shift back by 10%. Due to this the State is considering freezing Medi-Cal enrollment for undocumented individuals and potentially having a share of cost of \$100 for this population.</p> <p>v. In terms of local projects, Sara shared that Live Well Madera County (LWMC) will be convening a State of Our Health breakfast or lunch and currently looking for a speaker. For the planning, they are engaging with local agencies and leadership and community-based leadership.</p> <p>vi. Sara shared that the focus areas for Madera's community health improvement plan (CHIP) include diabetes and heart disease, substance use disorders, access to care and growing healthy families which addressed domestic violence and child abuse.</p> <p>vii. Public Health is also working on a project with the Central California Public Health Consortium (CCPHC) and looking to do a communications campaign around health literacy and patient behaviors. This will help address gaps in helping individuals navigate the healthcare system. MCPs are welcome to collaborate and support his efforts by sharing health plan materials. The CCPHC covers the following counties from Merced to Kern County as well as Calaveras, Mariposa, San Benito, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne.</p> <p>viii. Sara shared she has requested data from Anthem and CalViva Health related to patient behaviors and stated she did not include Kaiser Permanente as KP is a new MCP in the areas and might not have the size of patient population or the longevity to understand the patient behaviors.</p> <p>ix. Additionally, Sara reported on the Community Resilience Center progress. This is anticipated to be completed by 2028. Chrissie Doss is the new Madera County Behavioral Health Director. Sara and Chrissie have been collaborating on the plan to have public health prevention program staff colocated with behavioral health prevention program staff at this new location. This partnership will allow patients such as those identified with substance use disorders needing drug and other screening to also receive services from public health in the same location. 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<p>training center, a demonstration / commercial kitchen, etc. This will allow catering businesses and other businesses such as taco trucks the opportunity to produce/prepare food here while meeting all the environmental health requirements. Culinary classes are another potential use for his kitchen.</p> <p>x. Sara mentioned that Madera is looking at a potential partnership with Fresno CMAC around having a recording studio to expand the ability to create local communications.</p> <p>2) Immunization</p> <p>i. Melody shared public health continue to provide STI, TB and vaccines services at the clinic's new location due to the building remodeling. The address is 324 S Gateway Ave.</p> <p>3) Sexually Transmitted Disease (STI)</p> <p>i. Melody shared public health continue to provide STI services.</p> <p>4) Tuberculosis (TB)</p> <p>i. Melody reported the following for Minh: CDC recently updated their TB screening guidance for schools' entry, and this was distributed to Madera County schools.</p> <p>ii. Program working on designing a school education curriculum to present in elementary schools about TB prevention and hand washing practices that we hope will take place next fall.</p> <p>iii. Dr. Paul, Health Officers, is working on finalizing an albuterol standing order for Madera County schools.</p> <p>5) Maternal Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH)</p> <p>i. No report.</p> <p>6) California Children Services (CCS) – Lori</p> <p>i. Lori shared CCS is within the Children Medical Services team. This team also has foster care nurses and adult protective services (APS).</p> <p>ii. Over 1,400 active CCS cases and 141 kids at the Medical Therapy Unit (MTU). The team is really busy at the moment.</p> <p>iii. Working with state on Case Management Improvement Project (CMIP).</p> <p>iv. Nurses also cover lead poisoning coordination along with Maritza.</p> <p>7) Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Branch (CLPPB) – Blood Level Screening</p> <p>i. Lori reported that Sandra Hishida has retired May 1st. County looking to backfill her position.</p> <p>ii. Recently received 4-5 referrals for high lead and currently following over 100 referrals with children with various blood lead levels.</p>
