- Future mandatory data sharing with health plans, as per the state's requirements, is anticipated, even if timelines are unclear.	
- Continued focus on the exchange of data, especially related to CCS and ECM community supports.

- Preferred Data Transfer Method	
- Secure email is recommended for transferring information due to cost concerns associated with setting up SFTPs.

- Received a notice about potential MTU site closures, but both sites will remain in place despite the schools closing.

- Tuberculosis (TB) Program:	
- Increase in TB cases and related deaths; focus on preventing outbreaks.	
- Monitoring clients with Anthem Blue Cross for service utilization.

- Transition Planning for CCS	Team
- Need to establish a process for sharing transition plans of CCS children aging out with Anthem.	
- Other managed care plans have protocols in place; Anthem lacks an identified contact or protocol.	
- Requirement for Anthem to assign a contact or provide a secure email for monthly transition reports.	
- Transition report includes detailed child data (e.g., specialists, equipment, medications).	
- About six to eight such reports expected monthly, facilitating case management adaptation for aging-out CCS children.	
- Next Steps for Anthem	
- Anthem to identify a CCS liaison who can coordinate case manager assignments for CCS children transitioning out of the program.	
- Heidi to coordinate with Anthem's liaison to set up an appropriate communication channel or protocol.	
- Specific issues noted with CCS clients often in wheelchairs, facing long waits that affect therapy schedules and service operations.

- Recommendation for CCS-specific transportation guidelines given the unique needs of child clients.	
- Anthem should arrange to start receiving data by mid-July, including information on children nearing the transition age of 21.	
- Requires providing at least two emails or a group email for secure transfer or fallback to fax if necessary.	
- Coordination with the CCS liaison to verify the appropriate method and contacts for data receipt.	
- Anthem needs to identify and provide appropriate contacts (individual or group emails) for receiving this data.	
- Monthly reports will begin reaching Anthem by July, focusing on clients approaching 21, aiding in the transition planning process.	
- No special release of information (ROI) needed for sharing data between Medicaid and managed care plans, as it's covered under existing agreements.

Sharing and Exchange of Educational Resources MCPs located in the same county must coordinate DEI trainings that are reflective and encompassing of the criteria outlined in this APL so that if an MCP, Subcontractor, Downstream Subcontractor, or Network Provider completes the training for one MCP within the same county, then they will have met the obligation to complete the training for all other MCPs within the same county and can provide an attestation of training completion.
