

II.	Fresno County Department of Public Health Updates – Joe Prado  Manifest MedEx Update: This past Tuesday board of supervisor approved Manifest MedEx, a health information provider. The focus is on suicide prevention with Central Unified and Sanger Unified, by setting up a SUD prevention email system. Sets up an e-mail notification process from any ER to school counselor and school nurse, the system will also be available to the Department of Behavioral Health. Exodus is not part of HAE. This will provide anyone presenting as 5150, for the member to be tracked and be connected to resources, specifically addressing children that meet these criteria. Implementation by summer/spring of 2025. MOUs with school districts will be implemented.  Care Coordination: Care Coordination will be fed into community HIE. CalAIM implementation who will be able to assist those families, work through care coordination with these providers and services. Will help prevent duplication of services  H5N1 Response: Incident Command Response, it has exceeded capacity. Working with California Department of Food and Agriculture on response, provided testing and TAMIFLU for H5N1 for dairy employees. Great Opportunity to communicate with dairy farm employees, offering flu vaccines. Utilization of mobile health services.  Rabies Incident: Report of community member passed away form rabies infection. Fresno County resident that was a teacher at a Merced County school, handled a bat that was infected.	Fresno County DPH

VII. Program Updates

Community Health [CH] (includes Immunization /TB /DOT / CD/HIV /STD / CLPPP)

Fresno County Team

- Immunization Scotti. With update 15-16 providers, about 5,000 flu dosages being distributed through community. Including big event at Fresno State Student Center. H5N1 state created special season flu program for populations working with dairies, poultry and slime farms, they have enrolled one provider. Working to facilitate Covid-19 vaccine in the community. Annual school vaccine reporting, vaccination rates report to the state, dateline is 12/13. Providers may see an increase of vaccines for children.
- **TB/DOT Patricia.** Wrapping end of the year report to the state, 46 cases and 6 cases that were transferred. Hired LVN and assistant.
- HIV/STD Jena. Current number of syphilis is 146 cases. HIV 25 cases under investigation. Still seeing increase in woman diagnose with HIV, as of November 2024, there has been 22 new diagnoses for the year. No prenatal transfusion reported this year. Collaborating with pacific aid training center, planning a central valley regional summit in April of 2025. Focused on advancing HIV treatment. Office of Aids woman's community infographics focused on education community and one for providers. In April, they received one-time funding for hepatitis c, will attend a conference with goal of increasing screenings in Fresno County.
- CD / COVID Maria. Ending the year 898 cases CDI. H5N! still monitoring dairies in Fresno County, this started in 8/29/24. Provided with PPE, Covid Kits and educational material. First confirm human case of H5N1 in Fresno County, reported on Fresno County website. CDI investigated on 11/20 on confirm case of rabies death in Fresno County, including a media briefing.
- CLPPP Keyna. Currently short staff on working on basic cases of lead and lower levels. Some cases open and are closed right away. Not all providers are requesting venous testing which prolongs the case being open. Training is being offered to providers. Nurses are offering home visitation and follow up with environmental health team visit to see what the source maybe.

- **CPSP Yvonne.** Roundtable on 3/29/25 on anemia pregnancy. Meeting CPSP providers with resources and staff training are available to their staff. - Black Infant Health (BIH) Sabrina. No updates.
- Perinatal Equity Initiative (PEI) Gifty (not present). No updates.
- Foster Care Ann. Meeting with DSS in process with MOU with MCPs regarding the transfer of foster kids to MCPs. Meeting scheduled next week to continue discussion.
